“Recognises the Satoyama Initiative as a **potentially useful tool to better understand and support human-influenced natural environments** for the benefit of biodiversity and human well-being”

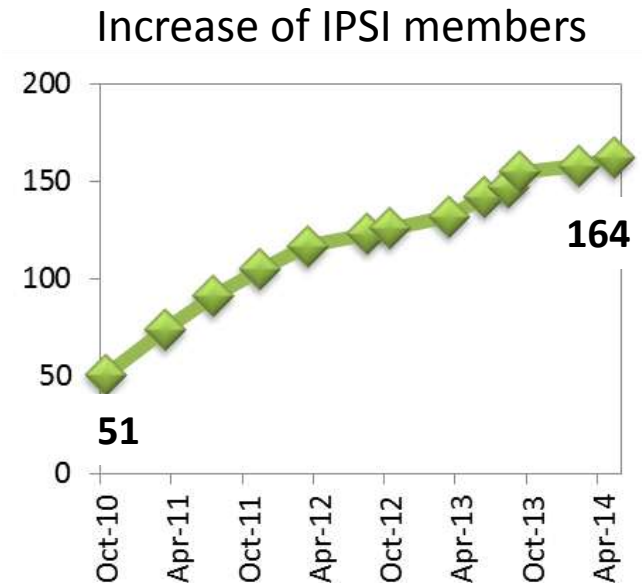
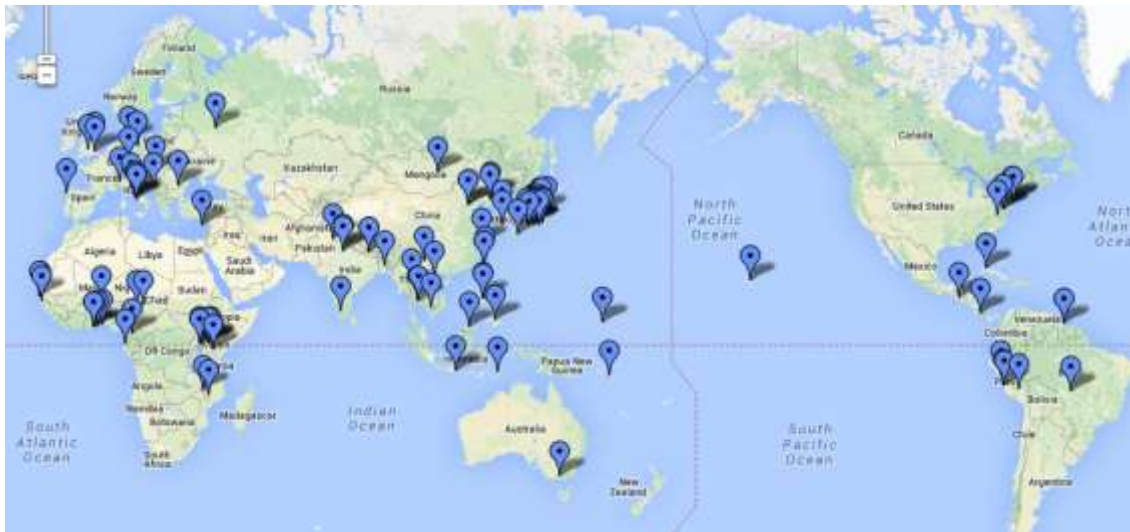
