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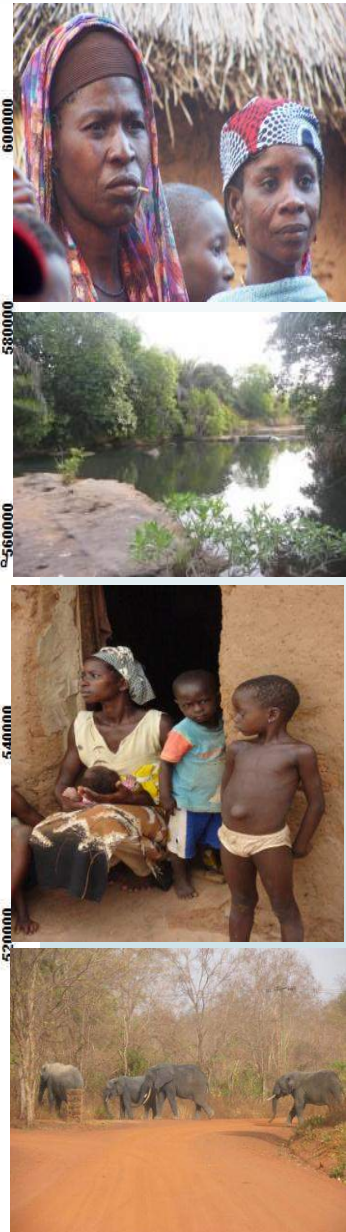
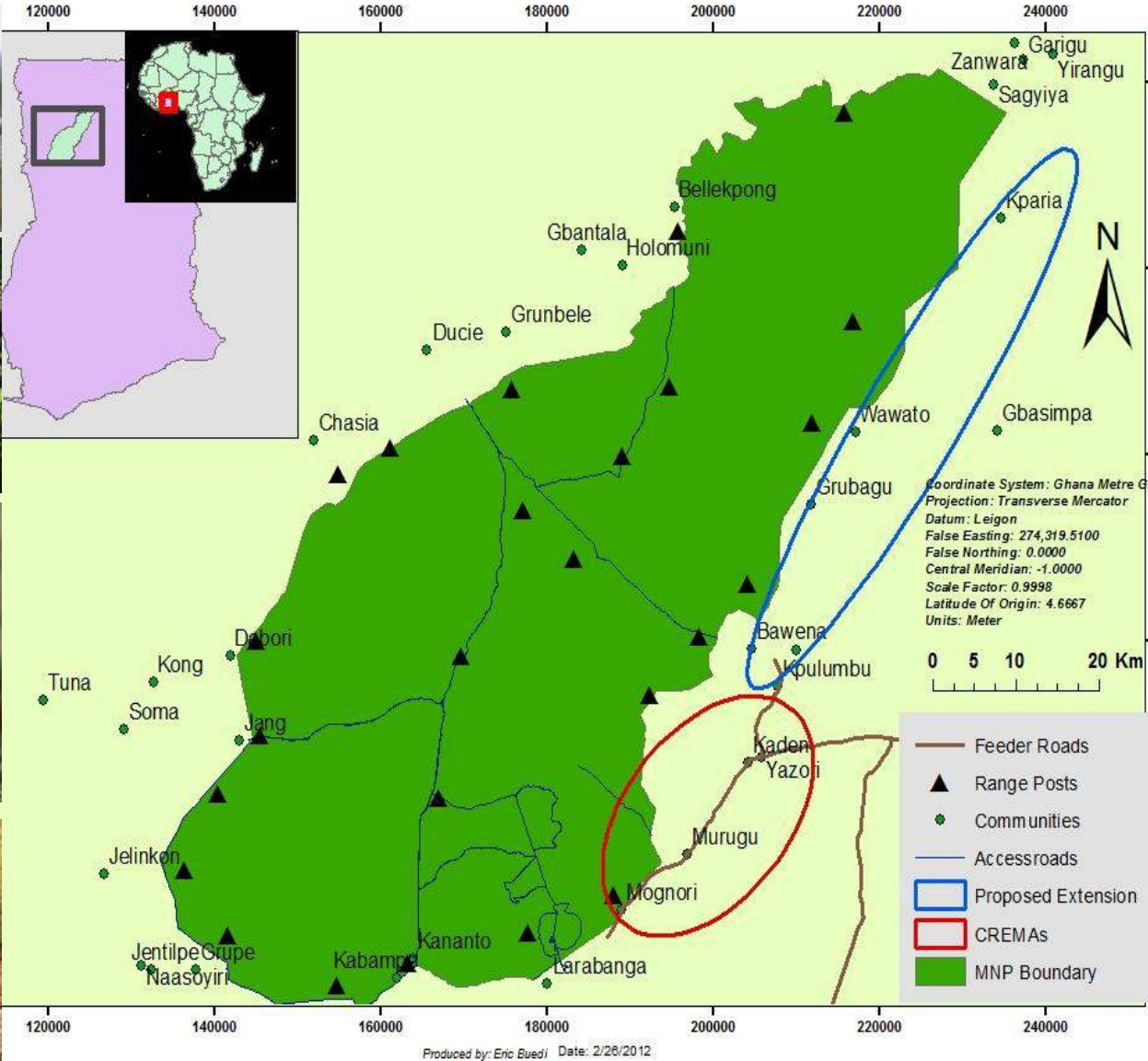
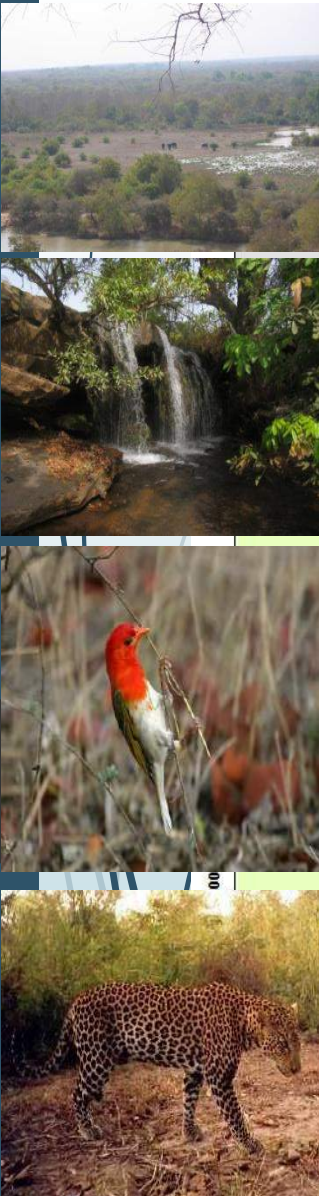

- Organic Shea, Beekeeping, VSLAs, Gari Processing, Improved ruminants enterprises supported and improved.
